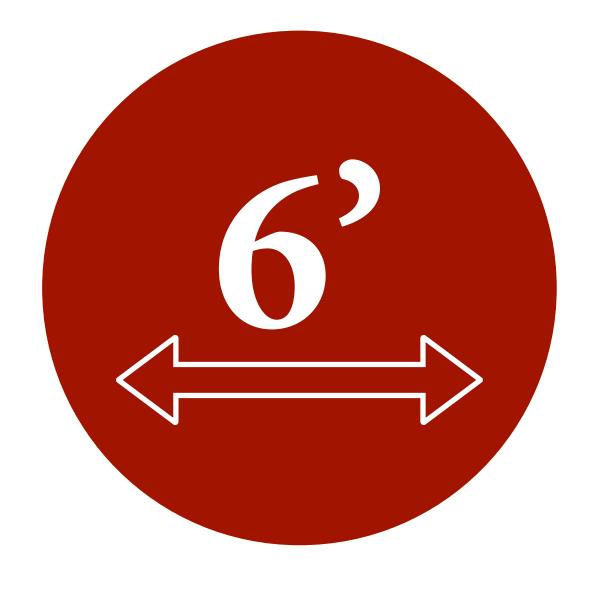




MASKS ON

PROTECT YOURSELF AND THOSE AROUND YOU:

KNOW HOW IT SPREADS

- The best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to the virus.
- The virus is thought to spread mainly from person-to-person.
 - Between people who are in close contact with one another (within 6 feet).
 - Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes.
- These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or can possibly be inhaled into the lungs.

MASKS ON

Cover your mouth and nose with a mask **at all times.**

6 FEET APART

Stay at least 6 feet away from others, whenever possible. This is very important in preventing the spread of COVID-19.

CLEAN HANDS

Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT OTHERS

- Stay home if you're sick
- Cover coughs and sneezes
- Routinely clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.

CONTROL AND PREVENTION

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, World Health Organization and governments worldwide are responding to COVID-19, a disease caused by a novel coronavirus not previously seen in humans.

The Nashville Symphony and Schermerhorn Symphony Center are committed to following recommendations by the CDC to ensure the re-opening of our building is done in a safe and healthy manner.

WHAT IS A CORONAVIRUS?

A coronavirus is part of a large family of viruses that can cause illness in animals or humans. In humans, a coronavirus can cause respiratory infections that range from the common cold to more serious diseases.

WHAT IS COVID-19?

COVID-19 is the disease caused by the most recently discovered novel coronavirus.

WHO IS AT RISK?

Everyone. Older adults and those with underlying medical conditions appear to be at a higher risk for developing complications from COVID-19 than others. Vaccine candidates are currently being approved and distributed across the United States. Regardless, all people, including those who have had COVID-19 or have been vaccinated, should continue to use facial coverings and social distancing to reduce the spread of the virus.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

COVID-19 symptoms are wide-ranging. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus.

People exhibiting a cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing may have COVID-19. Additionally, people with at least two of the following symptoms or a combination of these symptoms may have COVID-19: Fever; chills; repeated shaking with chills; muscle pain; headache; sore throat; new loss of taste or smell.

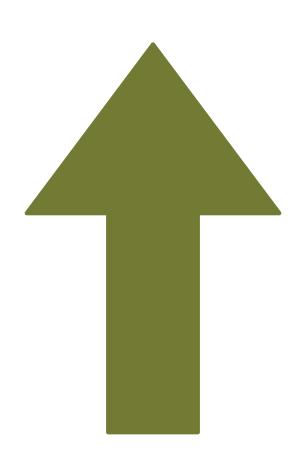


DO YOU HAVE ANY OF THESE SYMPTOMS?

- NEW LOSS OF TASTE OR SMELL



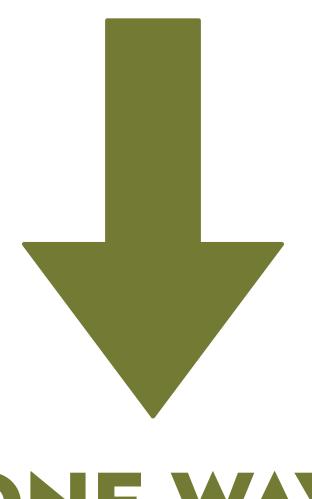
